AGED MARION WOMAN, HIT BY AUTO, BADLY INJURED

Condition of Mrs. Benjamin Bieber Held Critical; Police Absolve Driver

Mrs. Benjamin Bieber, 72, of ??? W Center ??, is in a critical condition at City Hospital today after being struck last night by an automobile driven by Harry Lewis 208 ???, at Prospect and Center ???.

The aged woman is suffering from injuries about the head, body bruises and lacerations of the right leg.

Police Captain J. S. Moody absolves Lewis of all blame for the accident.

According to Captain Moody, Lewis was driving east in Center st and stopped in the intersection of Prospect st until the signal gave traffic the right of way over Prospect st. When the signal changed Lewis started his car ??? into Prospect.

Mrs. Bieber, according to Captain Moody, was walking west in Center st, and started across Prospect st with the traffic signal set for Prospect st traffic.

Lewis' car struck Mrs. Bieber and dragged her north in Prospect st about 30 feet. She was taken to the hospital in C.E. Cartis & Co. ambulance.

Lewis was taken to police station at later released.

Mrs. Benjamin Bieber, 72, Expires at City Hospital; Funeral Wednesday

Mrs. Eudora A. Bieber, 72, of 180 W Center St, died late last night at City Hospital of injuries received when she was struck by an automobile at Center and Prospect about two weeks ago.

Mrs Bieber was the wife of Benjamin Bieber, cashier at the Erie Railroad freighthouse here.

Mrs. Bieber was born in Marion and had ben a lifelong resident of this city. She was actively affiliated with the Eastern ??? and the Presbyterian Church.

Besides her husband, she leaves two sons, Clarence of Columbus, and Ray Bieber of Dayton, a daughter, Mrs. Carl Burke of Cleveland, a sister, Mrs. Emma Ogier of Marion, and one granddaughter. [The granddaughter would be Anna Mae Burke.]
