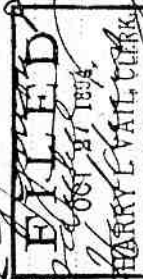

DECLARATION.



I, August Schumann

an alien, and a native of Germany

being duly sworn according to law, declare and say, that I first arrived in the United States on the

day of Nov. A. D. 1874; that it is **bona fide** my intention

to become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any Foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty, whatever, and particularly all allegiance and fidelity to

William II Emperor

of whom I am a subject, so help me God.

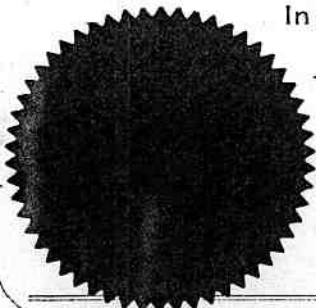

READ. This paper does not give the holder the right to vote or otherwise exercise any of the rights of citizenship. Aliens may be admitted to citizenship after having resided in the United States for five years, and in the State or Territory in which the application is made, for one year next preceding the filing of such application. This declaration must be made at least two years before applying for final admission; except as provided by section 2167 U. S. Statutes.

Admission to citizenship can only be granted by some court of record, having competent jurisdiction, before which the applicant must appear and file his written application, and produce evidence to the satisfaction of the court in support thereof.

Clerk of the court has no power to grant admission to citizenship. See revised statutes of the United States, sections 2165 to 2174 inclusive; and for penalties for violating naturalization laws, see sections 5395 to 5439 inclusive.

in *Germany*; that he first arrived in the United States on or about the _____
day of *Nov* 18*74*; that on or about the *15* day of *Oct* 18*92*

he duly declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States of America, the certificate
of such declaration being hereto attached, marked Exhibit "A," and made a part hereof; that he
has never borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the orders of nobility in the *Country*
from which he came; that he has never been confined in any penal institution of this state, or
any of the United States, under sentence of any court therein; that he is a man of good moral
character, attached to the principles of the constitution of the United States, and well disposed to
the good order and happiness of the same; that he is, by occupation, a *Laborer*
and now resides at *22 Buckeye St* Cleveland, Cuyahoga county, Ohio.

Wherefore, your petitioner prays, that on the final hearing of this petition he may
be admitted to all the rights and privileges of a naturalized citizen of the United States.
